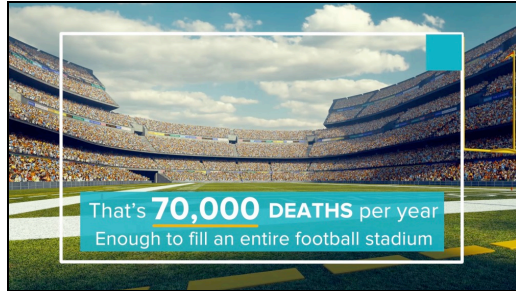

That's 70,000 DEATHS per year

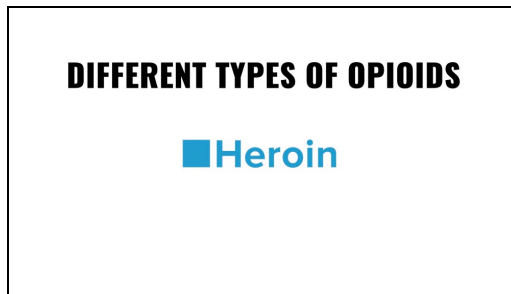

### LETHAL DOSES

Carfentanil is 5,000 times MORE powerful than heroin, making it EXTREMELY DANGEROUS

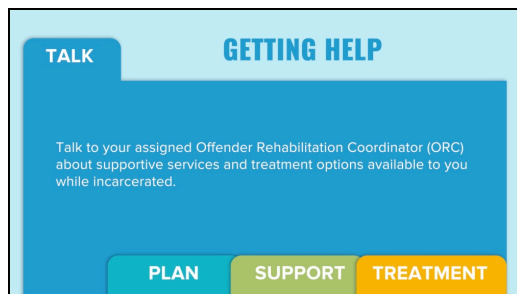
### FIRST 2 WEEKS after release from JAIL

129x more likely the risk of OVERDOSING

11x risk of DYING

NO TOLERANCE + Dangerous Opioids = OVERDOSE RISK

### GETTING HELP

TALK

Talk to your assigned Offender Rehabilitation Coordinator (ORC) about supportive services and treatment options available to you while incarcerated.

Have a plan to get into treatment when you are released  
– Community Supervision.

Even though you may not have used in a long time, the stressors and challenges experienced following release may pose a great risk for relapse.

Temptation will be strong, and you may experience intense cravings to use again.

Look for Recovery Supports – Recovery Centers will offer you activities.

Religious, mental health, and volunteer services may also support you in your recovery.

Be sure to ask your ORC how to access self-help activities, like AA and NA, as well.

Identify recovery supports - family, friends, activities, hobbies, community-based treatment services, etc.

Religious, mental health, and volunteer services may also support you in your recovery.

Be sure to ask your Offender Rehabilitation Coordinator how to access self-help activities, like Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous, as well.

Methadone

Buprenorphine (Suboxone)

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## Medication Assisted Treatment with Opioid Addiction

Methadone

Buprenorphine (Suboxone)

The key to their effectiveness is finding the proper dose. This involves starting at a lower dose and increasing it until the withdrawal symptoms are gone.

Is a monthly injection that blocks the effects of opioids  
Will prevent overdose if you relapse

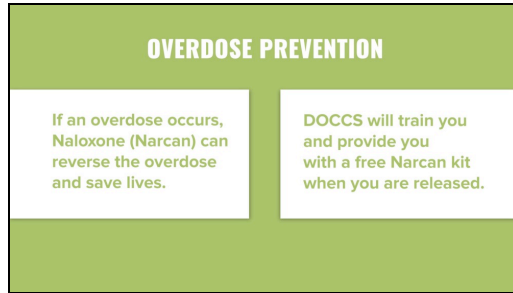
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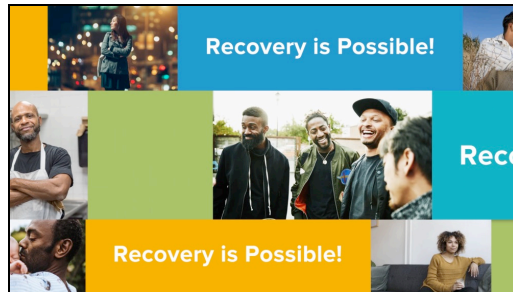


## OVERDOSE PREVENTION

If an overdose occurs, Naloxone (Narcan) can reverse the overdose and save lives.

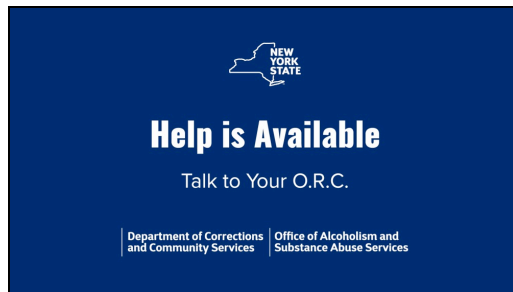
DOCCS will train you and provide you with a free Narcan kit when you are released.
