

SLATE INSTRUCTIONS:



1. Film in landscape mode as shown in this photo above.
2. Dress is upscale casual. Make-up and hair is natural, neat and polished.
3. Make sure you are close to the device to capture good audio and we can see your face in the frame (framing is from top of the head to chest).
4. You should be well lit and against a simple background with little to no background noise.
5. Slate the following:
 - Name, pronouns, agency, height, location base
 - Project: CBT4CBT DRUG REFRESH
 - Role name(s)
 - Indicate your availability for the following dates:
 - May 15, 16, 18 or May 22, 23, 24, 25
6. Full body pic (framed from top of head to toe)
7. Attach your current headshot, updated resume and reels/clips

SELF-TAPE INSTRUCTIONS:

Give us two *different* reads (see audition sides below)

AUDITION SIDES: MARIA

MARIA is the cousin or friend of ANNA and is mainly empathetic, kind, thoughtful and caring towards ANNA..

SCENE: ANNA is talking to MARIA. She is working hard to stay away from using drugs but her boyfriend Tony, who lives with her, hasn't been supportive. MARIA is very supportive of ANNA and her goal is to stay away from using drugs. She helps ANNA to problem-solve ways to deal with Tony.

SCREEN DIRECTION: Present lines to camera.

FADE IN:

INT.- KITCHEN - DAY

MARIA:

What's wrong? Is Tony still using...

ANNA: Yeah.

MARIA:

At home? With you around?

ANNA:

Yeah. And he keeps asking me to get high with him.

MARIA:

Oh, ANNA. That really is a problem.

ANNA:

Yeah, it's like, he doesn't understand that I'm trying to stay away from drugs. It's like he wants to bring me down with him. Like, he resents me for being able to stop using.

MARIA:

Is there something else too?

ANNA:

My checking account... He took out \$200 without telling me and our rent check bounced.

MARIA:

Oh ANNA, you have every right to be pissed-off.

ANNA:

Now that I'm not getting high, it's easy for me to see what's going on. I mean, I need to figure out the rent, but the real problem is Tony. He needs to respect my decision that I want to stop using drugs.

MARIA:

Have you talked to him about it?

ANNA:

Yeah. I've tried. It always turns into a big fight. I'm not even telling him to stop using--that would be great-- I just want him to stop asking me.

MARIA: Right.

ANNA:

And he has to respect my decision that I don't want to do it anymore.

MARIA:

So, what are you going to do?

ANNA:

I need to have a talk with him.

Not a fight. A talk. He needs to understand how important this all is to me. How important it is for me to stay away from drugs. He needs to support me and stop using around me and trying to get me to use with him.

You are in a *tough* situation...
